The total levy will be equal in amount to the total regular program district cost for the budget year and funds received under Iowa Code 267.14 as a budget adjustment for the budget year, and to be authorized annually, in combination as determined by the board, and may be used only for the purchase of technology and instructional materials.

SECTION 50.24. CANVASS BY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS. The county board of supervisors shall meet to canvass the vote at nine o'clock on the morning of the first Monday after the day of each election to which this chapter is applicable, unless the law authorizing the election specifies another date for the canvass. If that Monday is a public holiday, the provisions of section four point one (4.1), subsection twenty-two (22) of the Code shall control. Upon canvassing, the board shall open and canvass the tally lists and shall prepare abstracts stating, in words written at length, the number of votes cast in the county, or in that portion of the county in which the election was held, for each office or on each question on the ballot for the election. The abstract shall further indicate the name of each person who received votes for each office on the ballot, and the number of votes each person named received for that office, and the number of votes for and against each question submitted to the voters at the election.

The County Board of Supervisors shall canvass the returns for School Districts on the next Friday after the School Election. (See Section 277.20.)

The County Board of Supervisors shall canvass the vote for Area Vocational Schools or Area Community Colleges on the last Monday in September. (See Section 280A.15.)
